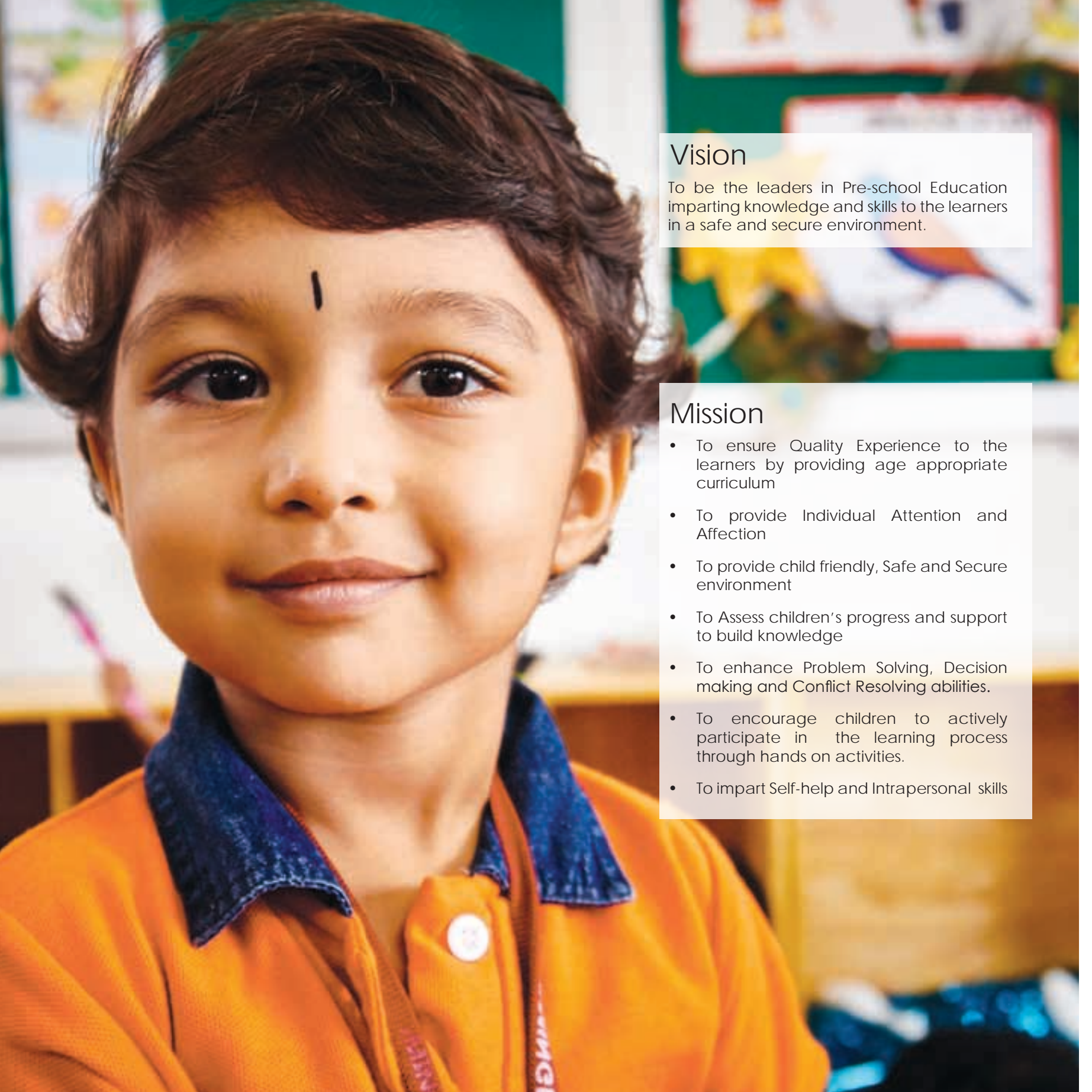

- Assurance of direct admission into Velammal Juniors.



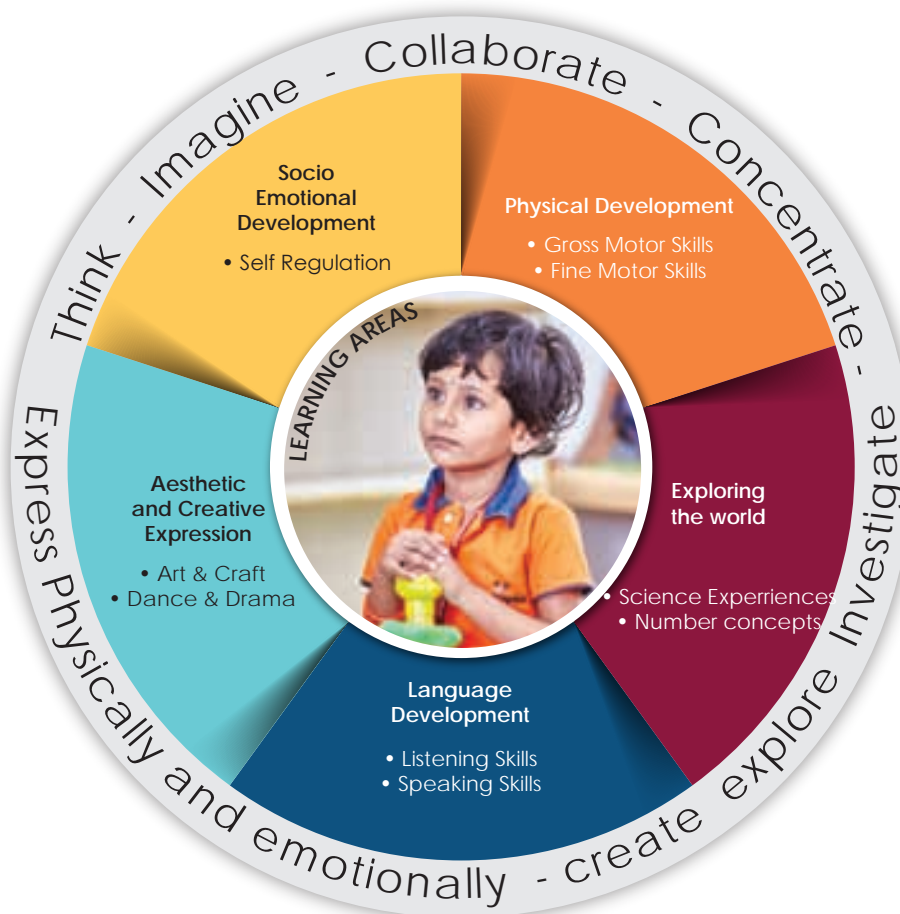
Our Curriculum

The Curriculum is child centered at every level, focusing on the teaching and learning processes. Children select their own activities and the facilitators guide their learning, allowing the children to interact with and learn from their peers. The Early Years Program is developed around the child's natural tendency to be an active, inquisitive and exploratory learner.



Goals of the Curriculum

- To respect the needs and rights of all children
- Building a long time love for learning
- To empower the child to make their own choices and decisions
- Organise learning Corners based on Domains of Development: Aesthetic and Creative Expression, Language Development and Pre-writing skills, Socio-Emotional Development, Motor-Skill Development, Number concepts, and Investigating the world
- The curriculum is designed on Developmentally Appropriate Practices
- To provide an inspirational environment of creativity, curiosity, inquiry and exploration
- The thematic approach to learning help children understand concepts clearly and hence the whole curriculum is structured into 'themes'.
- Project-Based Learning develops children to be thinkers



Socio-emotional Development: refers to the children's feelings towards objects, persons and situations. Children show a wide array of feelings, both positive and negative, such as fear, anger, jealousy, joy, pleasure, delight, love and curiosity.

Physical Development: Is about the mastery of the children over a variety of bodily skills. It is concerned with growth, development and control over the movements of the body. Gross **motor skills** refer to whole body and limb movements, balance and whole body coordination. **Fine motor skills** refer to manipulative skills that need use of hands, fingers, and coordination between eye and hand.

Exploring the world: Children make sense of the world by relating new experiences to some prior knowledge. The exposure at this corner allows children to explore and enable them to observe, communicate, organise, predict and apply. When children notice, wonder and explore things in their world they ask questions. During this inquiry process, teachers extend children's thinking by asking more questions and posing problems. And thus the active process of science is experienced and not taught.

Art and Aesthetic Development: Children express their ideas and feelings through art, drama, music and movement. The level of expressing interest in art and music activities is closely linked with the child's first experiences at Pre-school. Hence children are offered a variety of art and music activities to form a positive relationship towards it.

Language Development: Teachers make sure that language is always comprehensible to children giving young learners extended listening periods so they have the opportunity to gather meanings and associate them with language. Peer to peer communication also promotes language development. This happens naturally in a thoughtfully designed, play-based learning environment. Picture reading is encouraged to strengthen the visual discrimination skills, increase their vocabulary and understand sequence. Pre-writing skills are developed through material that involve eye-hand coordination such as clay, moulds, scribbling, lacing, weaving, crumpling etc.

Theme-based approach: The program has selected themes that are established and coordinated age appropriately, designed to promote developmental skills, and to enrich children's understanding of their world. The themes are inter-related linking the curriculum with basic developmental objectives. The themes have educational, social, cultural and emotional values.

Teaching and Learning Material: Thematic picture books and creative activity books form a part of our teaching and learning material. The books are specially designed for the purpose of developing pre-reading, pre-writing, number concepts, creative thinking and reasoning skills.

Assessment

The assessment for the Pre-Schoolers is very different from the assessment of older children. The greatest difference is in the way young children learn. They touch, manipulate objects, build, create, listen, act out stories, talk, sing, dance and play. Children are observed through a child friendly assessment system that helps the teachers and parents to understand children's interests and inclinations. This is not only a record of the child's academic achievement, but also a reflection of the child's development of sense of self and understanding of the world, which requires equal credit and encouragement. The continuous and comprehensive assessment helps to reflect and evaluate the all-round potential of the children.
